The Bishop of St Phillips and Andrews Cathedral, Mukono, Rev Enos Kitto Kagodo and Ms Cotilda Nakatte Kikomeko, the minister of social services in the Office of the Nnaabagereka, commissioned a new lower section block at Kwagalakwe Day and Boarding Primary School in Seeta, Mukono District, last week.

The lower section block has classes from pre-primary to Primary Four.

At the same event, the bishop presided over the graduation of nursery pupils, and confirmed 30 pupils into the Anglican faith.

He asked the newly confirmed pupils to be exemplary in ways that portray a good Christian image, including promoting environmental awareness in their areas during the holidays.
