The Chief of Defence Forces (CDF), Gen. Muhoozi Kainerugaba, has donated his official allowances to support the construction of a new classroom block and the renovation of existing buildings at Bombo Barracks Nursery and Primary School in Luwero district.

This initiative marks the first fulfilment of a pledge Gen. Kainerugaba made on assuming office to channel the allowances attached to his position into public projects where the need is urgent and evident.

A cheque worth sh300m was handed over to the school administration by the CDF's military assistant, Col Christopher Muwumba. Speaking during the event, which brought together the school community, Brig. Gen. Richard Karemire, the Uganda People's Defence Forces (UPDF) Joint Staff for Formal Education, Sports and Culture, emphasised the significance of the gesture.

children," he said.

Brig. Gen. Karemire thanked Gen. Kainerugaba for his continued

dedication to supporting the welfare of soldiers and their families, many of whom have children enrolled at the

school. He described the contribution as timely and essential in efforts to improve the learning conditions for pupils.

EDUCATION OF SOLDIERS' CHILDREN

The UPDF officer urged engineers to ensure the construction and renovation works are completed on schedule, noting that the project will directly enhance the education of the children of soldiers.

Brig. Gen. Karemire also pointed out other UPDF school projects being supported by the CDF, including the construction of Ruhengyere Army Primary School and the renovation of Lira Army Primary School, among others.

The handover ceremony was attended by the school administration, including the headteacher, Lt Sharon Namuwenje, and her deputy.
