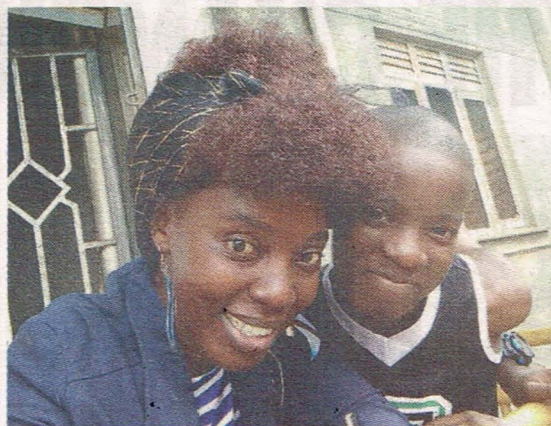
past papers and newspaper pull-outs provided by the school.

He hopes to pursue a career in medicine.

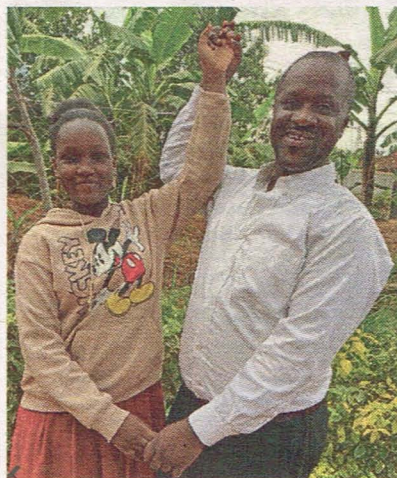
Despite the strong results, some parents face financial

Good Hope Foundation School headteacher Richard Namanya said the school posted an impressive performance, registering 40 first grades out of 51.

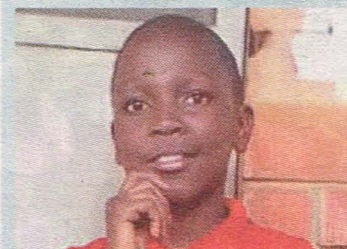


**Benon Gumisiriza of Apex Primary School, Kinoni in Lwengo district, scored aggregate 5**
