Caroline Natasha, the best female candidate in the 2025 Primary Leaving Examinations (PLE) in Kagadi district, wants to become an engineer after scoring aggregate 6 at Trust-Way Schools in Muhorro town council.

She says her ambition is driven by the lack of professional engineers in her community and the challenges surrounding science education in the area.

"Since I started studying, I have never seen or heard of anybody in our area graduating as a professional engineer. The so-called engineers are primary school dropouts who are mechanics and repairers

Natasha said. However, she expressed concern that her mother, Adrine Nyinamahoro

and her father, Henley Mugisa, a peasant, may fail to afford good schools to nurture her dream following their separation.

Mugisa said although he was proud of Natasha's performance, his financial situation may limit her progress.

"It is my prayer that I get help from the Government or well-wishers, otherwise my daughter may not fulfil her dream," he said.

Meanwhile, Mariam Katusabe, also of Trust-Way Schools, who scored aggregate 5, said she aspires to become a nun due to the domestic violence she has witnessed in her village and surrounding homes.
