She was taken to Kalisizo Hospital, where she was diagnosed with pneumonia and put on treatment. Unfortunately, she did not get better.

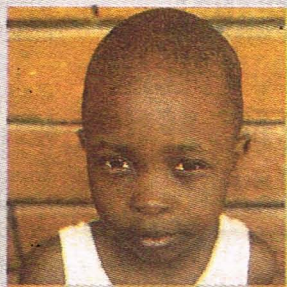
Kirabo says they later went to Masaka Children's Clinic, where doctors suspected heart defects. They were referred to Uganda Heart Institute at Mulago in Kampala, where it was



confirmed that she has two holes in the heart.

Khauthara was dumped on the streets of Kawanda, Nabweru sub-county in Wakiso district on June 30, last year. At the time, she was estimated to be three years old.

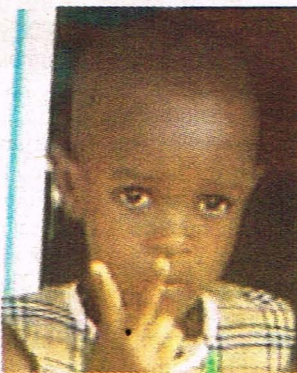

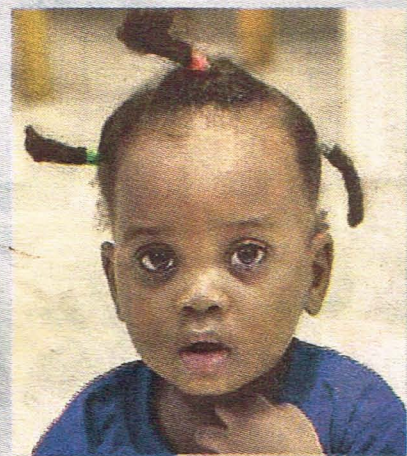
# Where are Nayebare's relatives?

"I took him to several clinics, but the health



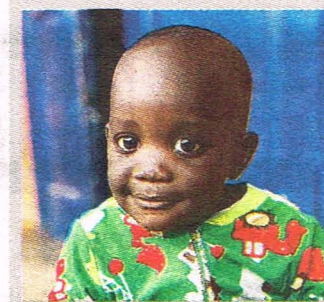
